Academic Info for Freshman

- It is VERY important that Freshman have a strong start to their academic career.
- 1/3 Rule- If you have an 80 freshman year, you have to average a 95 for the next TWO years in order to have a 90 overall average when you apply to colleges.

- Enroll in the hardest level of course work that you are able to handle.
- Show an upward progression in difficulty.
- Use your teachers as a guide to help you identify the next best course for you.
- Continue to take core academic courses even when you have fulfilled the state requirements.

Social Studies Progression

- Other AP elective courses include- AP Geography, AP Psychology, AP European History.



Math Progression- 4 years Encouraged

- Regents Track 1- Algebra 1A, Algebra 1B, Geometry Extended, Algebra II Extended or Advanced Mathematics.
- Regents Track 2- Algebra1, Geometry, Algebra II, Pre-Calculus.
- Honors Track/AP Track (starting in 8th grade)- Algebra 1H, Geometry H, Algebra IH, Math 12H, AP Calculus AB, BC or College Topics.
- Other AP Electives in Math- AP Statistics and AP Computer Science and Gaming.



Science Progression- 4 years Encouraged

- Regents Track 1- Earth Science, Living Environment, Marine Studies, 2 half year Science Electives.
- Regents Track 2- Living Environment, Earth Science, Chemistry, Physics
- Honors/AP Track (starting in 8th grade)-Earth Science Honors, Living Environment Honors, Chemistry Honors, AP Physics 1, AP Biology or AP Chemistry or AP Environmental Science or AP Physics C

BOCES Applications

- BOCES Applications are due to guidance on February 11. Please remember to ask for the application when you meet with your counselor for scheduling. Students going into a second year of BOCES must complete a new application for 2019-20.
- Acceptance into BOCES is not guaranteed.
 Grades and attendance will be closely reviewed.
- Practical Nursing and Pharmacy Technician programs require a pre-test.

BOCES and Career Training Programs

- We have 4 Career Training Programs in our building. They are:
 - Carpentry (3 periods)
 - Communication Design (3 periods)
 - Computer Repair Technician (3 periods)
 - Cosmetology (3 periods grade 11; 4 periods grade 12)



Cosmetology Applications

- Cosmetology applications are currently available in guidance. The earliest we will accept applications is Monday, December 3rd. We date and time stamp the applications we receive because space can be limited and we operate on a first-come, first-served basis.
- Grades and attendance will also be reviewed to determine acceptance into the program. Students going into their second year of Cosmetology do not need to reapply.
