Hutchins, Pat, 1942-. <u>Ten red apples.</u> 1st ed. New York: Greenwillow Books, c2000.

In rhyming verses, one animal after another neighs, moos, oinks, quacks and makes other appropriate sounds as each eats an apple from the farmer's tree.

P LON

Long, Loren. Otis and the scarecrow. New York, NY: Philomel Books, [2014].

When the farmer places a scarecrow in the cornfield, Otis the tractor and the farm animals try to make friends, but the scarecrow remains silent with a sour look on his face throughout the summer and fall.
