5.1.2. Approval of Agreement with J.J. Stanis and Company, Inc. for Long Term Disability 2016-17

The term of this agreement shall be from September 6, 2016 through June 30, 2017. This agreement has been reviewed and approved by the school district's attorney."

The costs associated are in accordance with the IDEA section 611 and section 619 federal funds consistent with federal and state statutes. The term of these agreements shall be September 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017 for a ten (10) month program or July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017 for a twelve (12) month program. These contracts have been reviewed and approved by the school district's attorney."

5.1.6. Approval of Related Services Agreement with All About Kids 2016-17
