a. Approval of Agreement Between Sachem Central School District and Westbrook Preparatory School

Upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, a **Motion** was made by Mr. Tripi, seconded by Mr. Isernia,, and carried unanimously (9-0) to approve the agreement between Sachem Central School District and Westbrook Preparatory School to provide adequate instruction, related services and/or a facility to students enrolled at the facility during the school year due to the IEP. The tuition rate shall be set by the State Education Department, based on the child's program. This contract shall be from July 1, 2012 to June 30, 2013. This will be paid by the Office of Student Services. This contract has been reviewed and approved by the school district's attorney.

b. <u>Approval of Agreements Between Sachem Central School District and Special Education</u> <u>Summer School 20122</u>

Upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, a **Motion** was made by Mr. Tripi, seconded by Mr. Isernia, and carried unanimously (9-0) to approve the agreements between Sachem Central School District and Central Islip UFSD, Deer Park UFSD, East Quogue SD, Hauppauge Public Schools, Islip UFSD, Kings Park CSD, Middle Country CSD, Patchogue-Medford UFSD, Sayville UFSD, Smithtown CSD and West Islip Public Schools for Special Education Summer School to students who reside outside the Sachem Central School District and would like to attend Sachem Special Education Summer School. The cost for the Instructional program is based on SED/OMS Certified 2012-2013 Tuition Rate per student and for related services the cost is based on SED/OMS 2012-2013 Regional Weighted Average per diem rate for 1:1 Aide (as per student's IEP). These agreements shall be in effect for the period July 1, 2012 to August 30, 2012. These agreements have been reviewed and approved by the school district's attorney.

c. <u>Approval of Agreement Between Sachem Central School District and C.H.A.T.S.</u>

Upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, a **Motion** was made by Mr. Tripi, seconded by Mr. Isernia, and carried unanimously (9-0) to approve the agreement between Sachem Central School District and C.H.A.T.S. to provide an Independent Educational Evaluation and copy of report. The cost is not to exceed \$200.00 to be paid by the Office of Student Services. This agreement shall be from January 1, 2012 to June 30, 2012. This contract has been reviewed and approved by the school district's attorney.

d. <u>Approval of Memorandum Of Agreement Between Sachem Central School District And The</u> <u>United Public Service Employees Union (UPSEU) On Behalf Of The Sachem Support</u>

Staff Unit (SSSU)

Upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, a **Motion** was made by Mr. Tripi, seconded by Mr. Isernia, and carried unanimously (9-0) to approve the Memorandum of Agreement between Sachem Central School District and the United Public Service Employees Union on behalf of the Sachem Support Staff Unit effective July 1, 2012.

- 1. Based upon a maintenance mechanic's annual performance of the 2012/13 school year, a maintenance mechanic with at least 12 years of service, has demonstrated excellence in performance, and demonstrates proficiency in multiple trades shall be given a \$3,000 stipend.
- 2. A maintenance mechanic with at least 5 years of service, has demonstrated excellence in performance, and demonstrates proficiency in multiple trades shall be given a \$2,000 stipend.
- 3. Any unit member who retains a New York State Pesticide or Herbicide License shall be given an annual stipend of \$1,000.00. This agreement has been reviewed and approved by the school district's attorney.

e. <u>Approval of Extension of Agreement Between Sachem Central School District and MSG Varsity</u> <u>Network LLC</u>

Upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, a **Motion** was made by Mr. Tripi, seconded by Mr. Isernia, and carried unanimously (9-0) to approve the extension of school registration and participation agreement with MSG Varsity Network LLC for an additional one (1) year period through June 30, 2013. MSG will provide a grant of \$2,000 each to Sachem High School East and North. MSG videos varsity games, maintains ongoing communication with the school district and their network. Additionally, they supply a video camera for the production of school produced content which is delivered to MSG Varsity Network.
