a. <u>Approval of Health and Welfare Service Agreement with Northport-East Northport UFSD</u>

Upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, a **Motion** was made by Mr. Tripi, seconded by Mr. Isernia, and carried unanimously (8-0) to approve the agreement between Sachem Central School District and Northport-East Northport Union Free School District to provide health and welfare services to students who reside in the Sachem Central School District. The rate for this service is \$763.04 per student. The term of this agreement shall be from September 1, 2012 through June 30, 2013. This agreement has been reviewed and approved by the school district's attorney.

b. Approval of Health and Welfare Service Agreement with Central Islip UFSD

Upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, a **Motion** was made by Mr. Tripi, seconded by Mr. Isernia, and carried unanimously (8-0) to approve the agreement between Sachem Central School District and Central Islip Union Free School District to provide health and welfare services to students who reside in the Sachem Central School District. The rate for this service is \$1024.58 per student. The term of this agreement shall be from September 5, 2012 through June 21, 2013. This agreement has been reviewed and approved by the school district's attorney.

c. Approval of Agreement with Franklin Covey Client Sales, Inc. and I Am a Leader Foundation

Upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, a **Motion** was made by Mr. Tripi, seconded by Mr. Isernia, and carried unanimously (8-0) to approve the services and sponsorship agreement between Franklin Covey Client Sales, Inc., I Am A Leader Foundation and Sachem Central School District for an I Am A Leader Foundation Grant for the Leader in Me. The schools selected for this grant are Grundy Avenue Elementary School, Lynwood Avenue Elementary School and Merrimac Elementary School. The cost for this agreement for the 2012-13 school year is \$5,000.00 per school for a total cost of \$15,000.00. This will be charged to a grant and staff development code. The term of this agreement is for one year only. This agreement has been reviewed and approved by the school district's attorney.

d. <u>Approval of Special Education Services Agreement with South Huntington UFSD</u>

Upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, a **Motion** was made by Mr. Tripi, seconded by Mr. Isernia, and carried unanimously (8-0) to approve the agreement between Sachem Central School District and South Huntington Union Free School District to provide special education services to parentally-placed students with disabilities, when such students attend private schools in the South Huntington Union Free School District, but reside in the Sachem Central School District. South Huntington UFSD shall be entitled to bill Sachem CSD in accordance with Education Law Section 3602-c and the Regulations or Rules of the Commissioner of Education. The term of this agreement shall be from July 1, 2011 through June 30, 2012.

e. Approval of Special Education Services Agreement with West Islip UFSD

Upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, a **Motion** was made by Mr. Tripi, seconded by Mr. Isernia, and carried unanimously (8-0) to approve the agreement between Sachem Central School District and West Islip Union Free School District to provide special education services to parentally placed students with disabilities, when such students attend private schools in the West Islip UFSD but reside in the Sachem CSD. The cost for these services is in accordance with Education Law Section 3602-c and the Regulations of the Commissioner of Education, Part 177. The term of this agreement shall be from July 1, 2012 through June 30, 2013.

f. Approval of Special Education Services Agreement with Smithtown CSD

Upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, a **Motion** was made by Mr. Tripi, seconded by Mr. Isernia, and carried unanimously (8-0) to approve the agreement between Sachem Central School District and Smithtown Central School District to provide special education services to parentally-placed students with disabilities, when such students attend private schools in the Smithtown CSD, but reside in the Sachem CSD. Smithtown CSD shall be entitled to bill Sachem CSD in accordance with Education Law Section 3602-c and the Regulations or Rules of the Commissioner of Education. The term of this agreement shall be from July 1, 2012 through June 30, 2013.

g. Approval of Health and Welfare Service Agreement with Smithtown CSD

Upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, a **Motion** was made by Mr. Tripi, seconded by Mr. Isernia, and carried unanimously (8-0) to approve the agreement between Sachem Central School District and Smithtown Central School District to provide health and welfare services to students who reside in the Sachem Central School District. The rate for these services is \$865.84 per student. The term of this agreement shall be from September 1, 2012 through June 30, 2013. This agreement has been reviewed and approved by the school district's attorney.

Approval of Eastern Suffolk BOCES Cooperative Bidding Resolution

Upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, a **Motion** was made by Mr. Isernia, seconded by Mr. Timo, and carried unanimously (8-0) to approve the following resolution:

WHEREAS, various educational and municipal corporations located within the State of New York desire to

bid jointly for generally needed services and standardized supply and equipment items; and

WHEREAS, the SACHEM CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT, an educational/municipal corporation (hereinafter the "Participant") is desirous of selectively participating with other educational and/or municipal corporations in the State of New York in joint bidding in the areas mentioned above pursuant to General Municipal Law § 119-0 and Education Law Section 1950; and

WHEREAS, the Participant is a municipality within the meaning of General Municipal Law § 119-n and is eligible to participate in the Board of Cooperative Educational Services, First Supervisory District of Suffolk County (hereinafter Eastern Suffolk BOCES) Joint Municipal Cooperative Bidding Program (hereinafter the "Program") in the areas mentioned above; and

WHEREAS, the Participant acknowledges receipt of the Program description inclusive of Eastern Suffolk BOCES' standard bid packet and the general conditions relating to said Program; and

WHEREAS, with respect to all activities conducted by the Program, the Participant wishes to delegate to Eastern Suffolk BOCES the responsibility for drafting of bid specifications, advertising for bids, accepting and opening bids, tabulating bids, awarding the bids, and reporting the results to the Participant.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Participant hereby appoints Eastern Suffolk BOCES to represent it and to act as the lead agent in all matters related to the Program as described above; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Participant hereby authorizes Eastern Suffolk BOCES to place all legal advertisements for any required cooperative bidding in <u>Newsday</u>, which is designated as the official newspaper for the Program; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a Participant Meeting shall be held annually consisting of a representative from each Program Participant. Notice of the meeting shall be given to each representative at least five (5) days prior to such meeting; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that an Advisory Committee will be formed consisting of five to ten representatives of Program Participants for a term of three (3) years as authorized by General Municipal Law §119-0.2.j.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Agreement with the Participant shall be for a term of one (1) year as authorized by General Municipal Law §119-0.2.j.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Participant agrees to pay Eastern Suffolk BOCES an annual fee as determined annually by Eastern Suffolk BOCES to act as the lead agent for the Program.
