Upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, a **Motion** was made by Mr. Tripi, seconded by Mr. Timo, and carried unanimously (7-0) to approve a consent agenda for mini contracts a –j.

a. Approval of Special Education Services Agreement with Three Village CSD, Extended School Year Program 2013

Upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, a **Motion** was made by Mr. Tripi, seconded by Mr. Timo, and carried unanimously (7-0) to approve the agreement between Sachem Central School District and Three Village Central School District for a student placed in its Extended School Year program for the 2013 summer. Three Village CSD will receive the 2011-12 New York State NRT rate of \$2,663.00. When the 2012-13 NRT rates have been determined, Three Village CSD will invoice Sachem CSD for the adjusted amount. The term of this agreement shall be from July 1, 2013 through August 9, 2013. This agreement has been reviewed and approved by the school district's attorney.

b. Approval of Health and Welfare Service Agreements 2013-14

Upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, a **Motion** was made by Mr. Tripi, seconded by Mr. Timo, and carried unanimously (7-0) to approve the agreements between Sachem Central School District and Babylon Union Free School District, Bayport-Blue Point Union Free School District, Bay Shore Union Free School District, Brentwood School District, Central Islip School District, Connetquot Central School District, East Hampton School District, East Islip School District, Eastport/South Manor CSD, Hauppauge School District, Islip Union Free School District, Longwood Central School District, Middle Country Central School District, Patchogue-Medford School District, Rocky Point Union Free School District, Sayville Union Free School District, Seaford UFSD, Smithtown Central School District, Southampton Union Free School District, South Country Central School District, South Huntington SD, Three Village Central School District and William Floyd School District to provide health and welfare services to non resident students who attend a nonpublic school located within the Sachem Central School District. The cost is \$941.94 per student for the period of September 1, 2013 through June 30, 2014. These agreements have been reviewed and approved by the school district's attorney.

c. **Approval of Agreement with Ascent: A School For Individuals With Autism 2014-15**

Upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, a **Motion** was made by Mr. Tripi, seconded by Mr. Timo, and carried unanimously (7-0) to approve the agreement between Sachem Central School District and Ascent: A School for Individuals with Autism to provide adequate instruction, related services and/or a facility to students enrolled at the facility during the school year. The School District will pay the tuition rate set by the State Education Department. The term of this agreement shall be from July 1, 2014 to June 30, 2015. This agreement has been reviewed and approved by the school district's attorney.

d. **Approval of Agreement with Cleary School for the Deaf 2014-15**

Upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, a **Motion** was made by Mr. Tripi, seconded by Mr. Timo, and carried unanimously (7-0) to approve the agreement between Sachem Central School District and Cleary School for the Deaf to provide adequate instruction, related services and/or a facility to students during the school year. Sachem School District shall pay for each child, the per pupil charge (PPC) set by the commissioner of the New York State Education Department. The term of this agreement shall be from September 1, 2014 to June 30, 2015. This contract has been reviewed and approved by the school district's attorney.

e. **Approval of Special Education Services Agreement with Three Village CSD 2012-13**

Upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, a **Motion** was made by Mr. Tripi, seconded by Mr. Timo, and carried unanimously (7-0) to approve the agreement between Sachem Central School District and Three Village Central School District to provide special education services to parentally-placed students with disabilities, when such students attend schools in Three Village Central School District but reside in Sachem Central School District. Three Village CSD shall be entitled to bill Sachem CSD in accordance with Education Law Section 3602-c and the Regulations or Rules of the Commissioner of Education. The term of this agreement shall be from July 1, 2012 through June 30, 2013. This agreement has been reviewed and approved by the school district's attorney.

f. **Approval of Special Education Services Agreement with West Islip UFSD 2013-14**

Upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, a **Motion** was made by Mr. Tripi, seconded by Mr. Timo, and carried unanimously (7-0) to approve the agreement between Sachem Central School District and West Islip Union Free School District to provide special education services to parentally placed students with disabilities, when such students attend private schools in the West Islip UFSD but reside in Sachem CSD. The cost for these services is in accordance with Education Law Section 3602-c and the Regulations of the Commissioner of Education, Part 177. The term of this agreement shall be from July 1, 2013 through June 30, 2014.

g. **Approval of Agreement with ECG Engineering, L.L.C.**

Upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, a **Motion** was made by Mr. Tripi, seconded by Mr. Timo, and carried unanimously (7-0) to approve the following resolution:

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education hereby appoints the firm of ECG Engineering, L.L.C. for the purpose of providing engineering services in support of a potential Energy Performance Contract for the Sachem Central School District in accordance with the terms and conditions of the attached agreement;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Education hereby authorizes the President of the Board of Education to execute such Agreement between the Board of Education and ECG Engineering, L.L.C.

h. **Approval of Agreement with Advanced Psychological Assessment, P.C. 2014-15**

Upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, a **Motion** was made by Mr. Tripi, seconded by Mr. Timo, and carried unanimously (7-0) to approve the agreement between Sachem Central School District and Advanced Psychological Assessment, P.C. to provide neuropsychological evaluation services. The rate is \$300 per hour, not to exceed ten (10) hours. This agreement shall be in effect for the period July 1, 2014 to June 30, 2015. i. Approval of Agreement with Creative Tutoring, Inc. 2014-15

Upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, a **Motion** was made by Mr. Tripi, seconded by Mr. Timo, and carried unanimously (7-0) to approve the agreement between Sachem Central School District and Creative Tutoring, Inc. to provide home teaching and related services in accordance with the State Education regulations, using only teachers certified by the New York State Education Department. The rates are as follows:

This contract shall be in effect from July 1, 2014 through June 30, 2015. This contract has been reviewed and approved by the school district's attorney.

j. Approval of Special Education Services Agreement with Middle Country CSD 2013-14

Upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, a **Motion** was made by Mr. Tripi, seconded by Mr. Timo, and carried unanimously (7-0) to approve the agreement between Sachem Central School District and Middle Country CSD to provide special education services to parentally-placed students with disabilities, when such students attend private schools in the Middle Country CSD, but reside in the Sachem Central School District. Middle Country CSD shall be entitled to bill Sachem CSD in accordance with Education Law Section 3602-c and the Regulations or Rules of the Commissioner of Education. The term of this agreement shall be from July 1, 2013 through June 30, 2014. This agreement has been reviewed and approved by the school district's attorney.

Donation - Wenonah Elementary School

Upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, a **Motion** was made by Mr. Isernia, seconded by Ms. Ahearn, and carried unanimously (7-0) to accept with gratitude, a donation in the amount of \$159.50 from Wenonah Elementary School to Wenonah's Special Olympics Club.
