6.1.1. <u>Approval of Special Education Services Agreement with Eastport South</u> <u>Manor CSD 2014-15</u>

RECOMMENDED ACTION: "that, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, the Board of Education approves the agreement between Sachem Central School District and Eastport/South Manor Central School District to provide special education and related services to students with disabilities, when such students attend schools in the Eastport South Manor Central School District.
