6.1.1. <u>Approval of Special Education Services Agreement with South Huntington</u> <u>UFSD 2015-16</u>

RECOMMENDED ACTION: "that, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, the Board of Education approves the agreement between Sachem Central School District and South Huntington Union Free School District to provide special education services to parentally-placed students with disabilities, when such students attend private schools in the South Huntington Union Free School District, but reside in the Sachem Central School District. South Huntington UFSD shall be entitled to bill Sachem CSD in accordance with Education Law Section 3602-c and the Regulations or Rules of the Commissioner of Education. The term of this agreement shall be from July 1, 2015 through June 30, 2016. This agreement has been reviewed and approved by the school district's attorney."

6.1.2. Approval of Agreement with Long Island Developmental Consulting 2015-16

RECOMMENDED ACTION: "that, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, the Board of Education approves the agreement between Sachem Central School District and Long Island Developmental Consulting to provide Applied Behavior Analysis services to designated special education students pursuant to the Individualized Education Program(s) ("IEP") developed for the student(s) by the CSE.
